Iwaki Beaches Opening this Month!

The beach season is just about underway in Iwaki with the city's beaches opening over the period of 13 July to 15 August.

This year, four beaches will open. In addition to Yotsukura, Nakoso and Utsuho beaches, Hisanohama-Hattachi Beach will reopen for the first time in 9 years. To celebrate the start of the beach season in Iwaki, beach opening ceremonies will be held on all four beaches, with the main ceremony held at Nakoso Beach, from 10am-11am.

These beaches will have lifeguards on duty from 9:00am-4:00pm during the month-long opening period. Remember not to swim at any beaches other than the four designated bathing areas as all other beaches are not monitored by lifeguards.

Speech Contest for the 18th Iwaki Global Citizens' Festival

Time and Date: Sunday, 24 November 1pm-4pm

Venue: Large Hall (10F) inside Furutakiya Inn, Yumoto, Joban

Theme: "Your thoughts about living in Iwaki"

Conditions: Anyone who lives in Iwaki and who is either of foreign nationality, has non-Japanese ancestry (i.e. Anyone whose first language is not Japanese) may participate

- There are two entry categories: a general category and one for students attending higher educational institutions
- The speeches must be in Japanese
- The speeches must not be longer than 5 minutes
- The speeches can only be done individually (by 1 person only)

Judgement: The winner will be decided by a vote from the judges and audience vote. You won't be judged on how well you speak Japanese but on the contents of your speech

Prize: The first placed winners of both categories will receive a certificate and ¥20,000 prize money. There will be other various prizes available and everyone will receive a prize for participation
