Closure of Public Facilities over the New Year's Period

Most public facilities will be closed over the New Year's period from 28 December 2019 – 5 January 2020.

Closed from 28 Dec 2019 – 5 Jan 2020

- All Iwaki City Offices including City Hall, Branch Offices and Citizens Service Centres (Iwaki Station Citizens Service Centre open 10am-7pm on 26-28 Dec & 4 Jan, 10am-6pm on 5 Jan)*
- Waterworks Bureau

Closed from 29 Dec 2019 – 3rd Jan 2020

- All Iwaki City Gymnasiums and Sports Facilities (Shinmaiko Heights facilities will remain open)
- Iwaki City Cultural Centre, Lifelong Learning Plaza and Alios (Iwaki City Art Museum closed 28 Dec – 4 Jan)
- All Civic Centres and Community Halls
- All City Libraries (Iwaki City Library open 10am-6pm on 29 & 31 Dec and 2-3 Jan)

Hashigonori Acrobatic Ladder Stunts by Firemen

Hashigonori is a traditional event dating back to the Edo Period that involves firemen performing acrobatic stunts on a 5.5m ladder. This event is held at the beginning of every year as part of the New Year's parade for Iwaki's firefighters.

This year, the Hashigonori will be held on **Sunday 5 January**. The following are some of the main venues where you can watch this performance:

Okunitama Shrine Torigoya Hut Burning Ritual	Wed 8 th Jan; Ceremony from 4pm, Ritual burning from 7pm Okunitama Shrine, Taira	<i>Torigoya</i> are small huts made of bamboo that are lit on fire at the beginning of each year. People usually put their New Year's ornaments or other good luck charms inside the <i>torigoya</i> to burn. It is said that if you eat mochi rice cakes that are roasted by the flames of the burning hut you will be free of illness for the whole year. It is quite common for the bucket carrier to "accidentally" spill cold water on the spectators, so you may want to be prepared to get wet when attending the festival.
